The symposium is a cross-disciplinary event with focus on the use and meaning of water in human adaptation to the environment in the Near East and Northern Africa from the earliest traces of human activities to modern times. The symposium brings together scientists of culture and nature in order to shed light on the most crucial challenge for survival, access to and use of water - physically as well as metaphorically.

Key note speakers are Prof. emer. Hans J. Nissen (Freie Universität Berlin) and Prof. Zheng-Tian Lu (University of Chicago)

Twenty invited experts present their papers followed by questions and comments.
