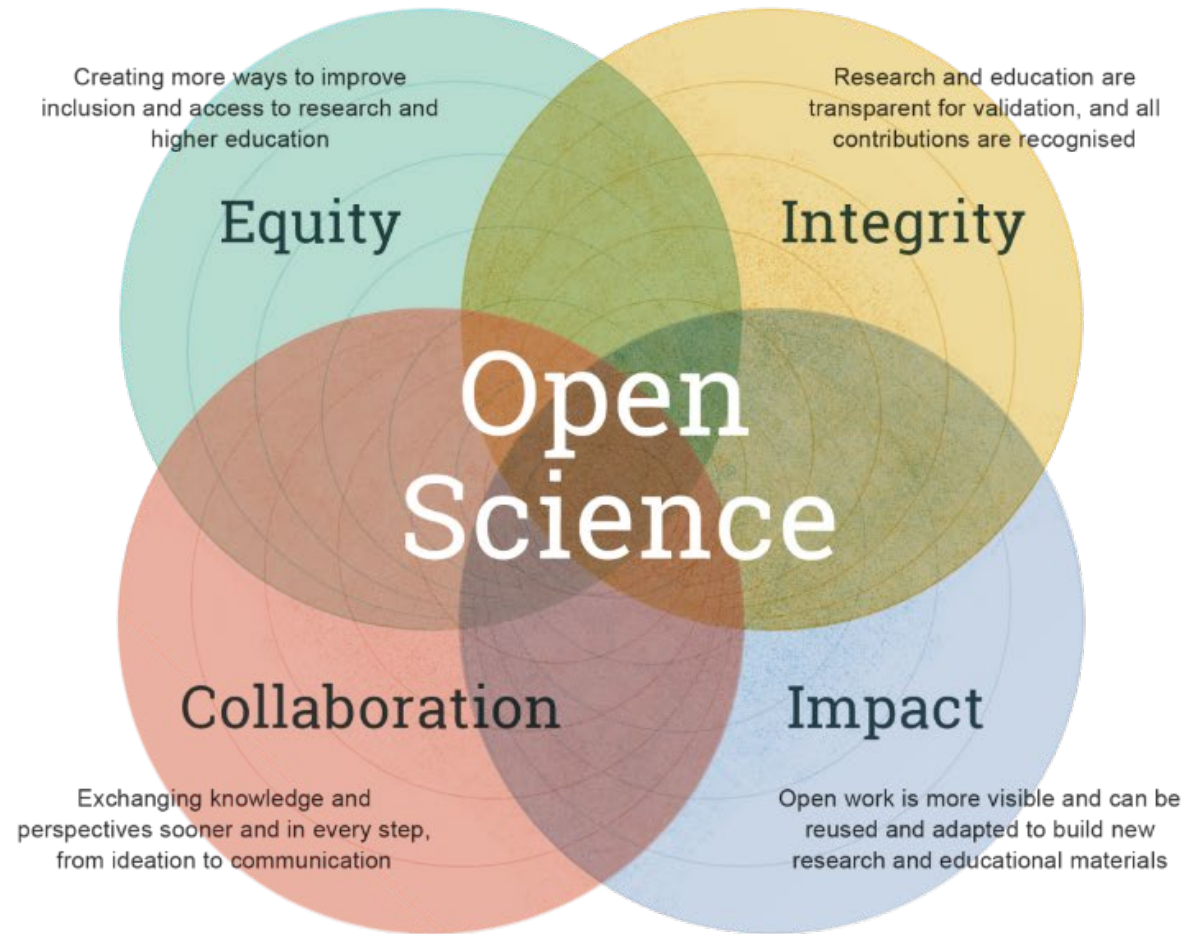
To support and make strategic decisions on the open science agenda at AU

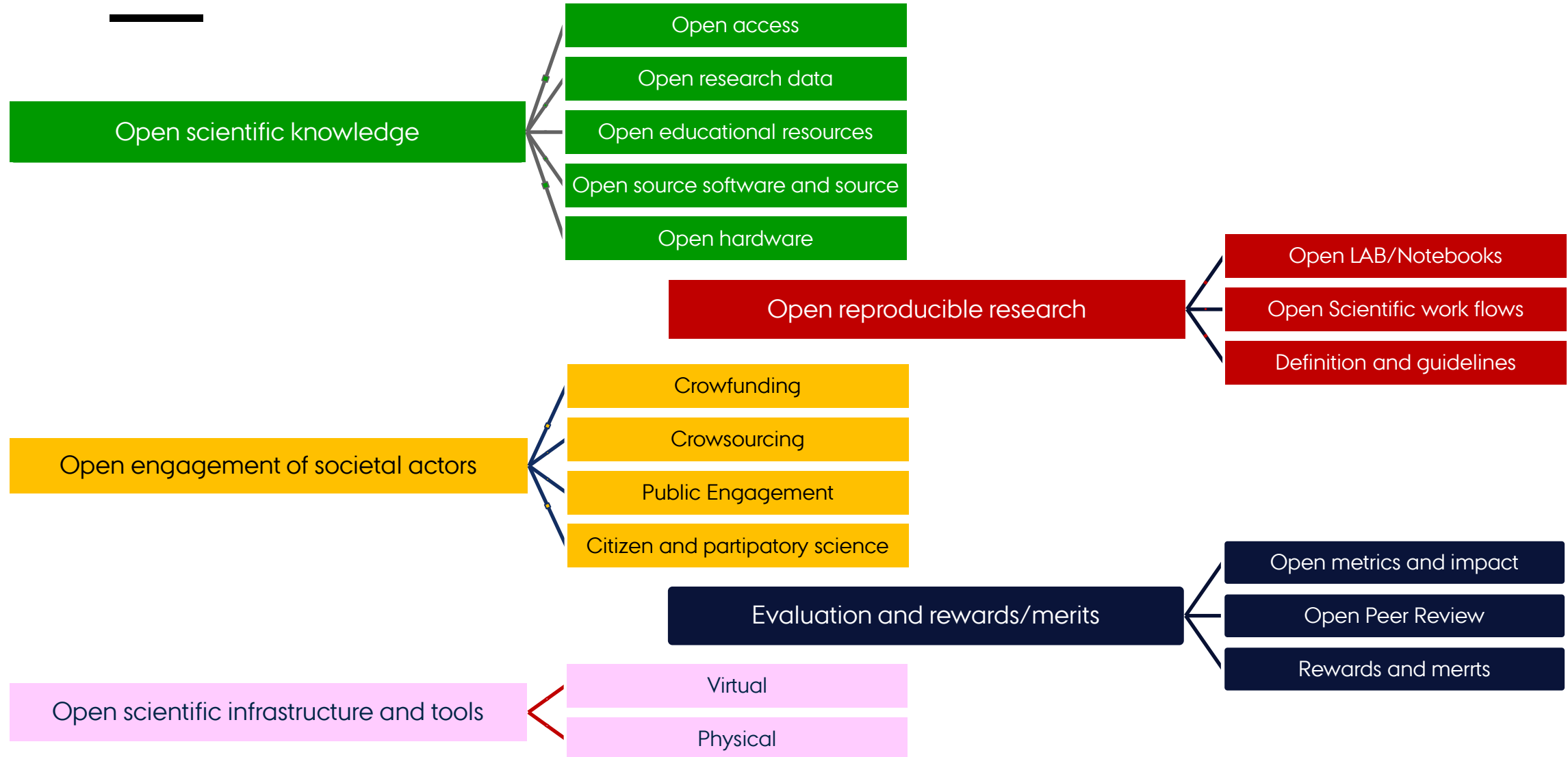

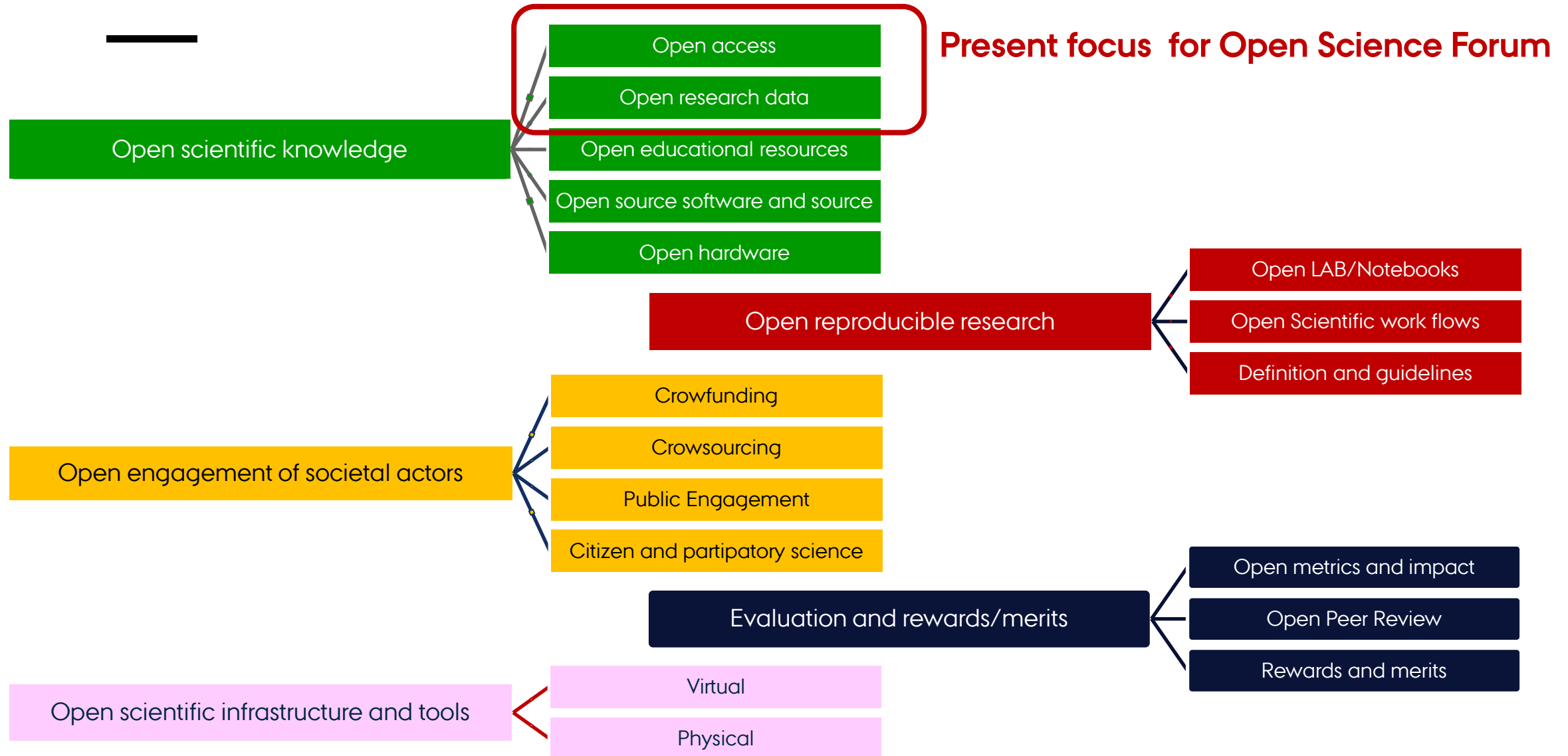
